## **TTM Planner Qualification Update 2021**

In line with the recent notification from Waka Kotahi - NZ Transport Agency, Road Worker Safety and TTM Update 6 September 2021, Christchurch City Council will effective immediately be processing submissions of Traffic Management Plans from Temporary Traffic Management planners who have not obtained qualified planner endorsement.

To enable timely and efficient processing of TMPs, Council will require Planners who are yet to obtain their endorsement, to have attended the TTM Planner training; and have submitted at least one TMP for assessment to Waka Kotahi.

In addition to the above requirements, Council require applicants to provide confirmation of a TMP being submitted for assessment to Waka Kotahi. Applicants need to provide this prior to the TMP being processed by the Temporary Traffic Management Team. Should confirmation of a TMP being submitted to Waka Kotahi for assessment not be received with the TMP application, the submitted TMP will not be reviewed and the application declined.

Evidentiary support must be provided within the TMP application as part of a submission to the MyWorksites system to enable consideration of TMPs submitted by TTM planners who are yet to obtain their endorsement. Emails to the tmc@ccc.govt.nz will not be accepted as evidentiary support.

Thank you for your assistance in ensuring that TMPs submitted to Christchurch City Council's TTM team are able to be processed in a timely and efficient manner.
