

INTRODUCTION

[1] This is an application by the St Albans Catholic School PTA for an On-Site Special Licence for premises known as the St Albans Catholic School situated at 49 Rutland Street, Christchurch. The occasion is a School Gala Fundraiser to be held on Friday 10 March 2017 between the hours of 5.00 pm to 7.45 pm. The applicant has appointed a person take charge of the licensed area which will be contained within a small area outside in the school grounds. This is an annual event and there have been no problems with similar events in the past.

[2] There have been no objections to this event, nor any wish to be heard expressed by members of the public and neither has the application been opposed by the Licensing Inspector or the NZ Police.

[3] The Medical Officer of Health has, however, reported in opposition. Such opposition does not necessarily require a public hearing, s202 of the Act providing that only public objections require this. The Committee may choose to decide the matter on the papers although s191(2) requires a full quorum of three not just the Chairperson sitting alone. The Committee has given careful consideration to the matter and has decided that a public hearing is not necessary. We therefore proceed to determine the matter on the papers.

THE OPPOSITION BY THE MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH

[4] On the 21 February 2017 a letter in opposition was receive from Dr Humphrey the Medical Officer of Health, in the letter the matters covered are the same as the Medical Officer of Health has put before the Committee in past applications and hearings.

[5] On balance we have preferred the opposing view, which points to the positive influence of children seeing parents having a social drink in a socially acceptable manner in a controlled and family oriented environment. We are not setting ourselves up as experts in the matter.

[6] We are required to reach our decision on the information before us and we are not convinced that the granting of this application is likely to have the consequences that the Medical Officer of Health suggests.

[7] The Medical Officer of Health has contacted the applicant and discussed his concerns. No communication has been received from the applicant indicating her desire to withdraw or change her application.

[8] We are required as in all decisions to consider the object of the Act as set out in s4. S4 (1) says:

The object of this Act is that-

- (a) The sale, supply, and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly; and*
- (b) The harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimized.*

S4 (2) goes on:

For the purposes of subsection (1), the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol includes-

- (a) any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behavior, illness, or injury, directly or indirectly caused, or directly or indirectly contributed to, by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol; and*
- (b) any harm to society generally or the community, directly or indirectly caused, or directly or indirectly contributed to, by any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behavior. Illness, or injury of a kind described in paragraph (a).*

[9] There will be agreement that we are not discussing excessive consumption of alcohol here. What is envisaged is the opportunity for members of a community to take time out in the course of a community event to have a glass of beer or wine in the company of their children, the children's teachers and the parents of other children going to the school.

[10] The Medical Officer of Health's argument is that, while having alcohol at an event focused on children and families on school grounds with children present will contribute to harm to society generally by normalizing the consumption of alcohol.

[11] The applicants in this case are responsible people seeking a special licence for a community event. They are seeking a licence as the law allows them to do. We see no reason why they should not get one and they are granted a Special Licence pursuant to s104(1).

[12] A **waiver** has been granted pursuant to s.213(2) of the Act in respect to the fact that the applicant has been granted an exemption to the provisions of s.213(1) and is not required to have a duty manager. Patrick O'Neill has been nominated as a person to manage the conduct of the sale of alcohol under the licence. The Committee sees no problem with this as it considers the event and from the information available to be a very low risk event.

[13] The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

Compulsory Conditions

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) Alcohol may only be sold under the licence on the following day and during the following hours:

Friday 10 March 2017 between the hours of 5.00 pm to 7.45 pm

- [7] I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and we grant the applicant an off licence pursuant to sec 104(1).
- [8] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to fail to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act; specifically sections 46 to 63. 231(1).

- [9] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.
- [10] The applicant's attention is also drawn to section 14 of the Regulations requiring procedures to be put in place in any ordering process to ensure that persons purchasing alcohol are over the minimum purchase age and that any prospective receiver of alcohol (if sent to another person) is also over the minimum purchase age.
- [11] This requirement is to be met when first entering the site and again immediately before the sale of any alcohol is completed.
- [12] In terms of section 15, the applicant must include on the internet site a legible image of the licence or a clearly identified link to such an image. On every receipt, or in every catalogue, the licence holder's name, the licence number and the expiry date of the licence must be printed.
- [13] The licence will be subject to the following conditions and all other conditions as identified on the licence.
- [14] Section 40 of the Act applies to the licence, the licensee is authorised to sell alcohol from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.
- [15] a legible copy of the renewed licence must be displayed within 20 working days of its issue.

Compulsory conditions

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours:
- Any time on Any day**
- (c) An exemption from trading hours restrictions for remote sales of alcohol applies which may be made on anytime on any day

Discretionary conditions

The following discretionary conditions:

- (a) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:

- Alcohol must only be sold and supplied on the premises in accordance with the premises plan submitted with the application.
- (c) No direct sales may be made.

Conditions applying to all remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol:

- (a) The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the license holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site:
- (b) The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires.
- (c) A copy of the licence or a clearly identified link to such an image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age:
 - i) In the case of an order made using an internet site, telephone order, or physical order - the prospective buyer must declare that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over) -
 - (i) once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
 - (ii) again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

Other restrictions and requirements

I recommend the following restrictions and requirements are noted on the licence:

Section 59 - Requirements relating to remote sales by holders of off-licences

Sections 212 –Appointment of Managers.

Water must be freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

Introduction

- [1] This is an application by Blackburn Retail Holdings Limited for the renewal of an Off-Licence in respect of premises situated at 57 Peer Street, Christchurch known as Ilam New World .
- [2] The premises trades as a 'supermarket'.
- [3] The current license number is **060/OFF/1/2012**.
- [4] The application was duly advertised and there was no public objection received.

Inspector's Report.

- [5] According to the Alcohol Licensing Inspector's report the premises has traded in its current location for about five years..
- [6] The applicant has not come to the attention of the agencies and is considered suitable to hold a licence.
- [7] The premise is located within a residential area of the city.
- [8] An initial application was submitted to the Licensing team at the Christchurch City Council which showed the current location of the single area
- [9] The Inspector reported no issues with the revised design and layout of the premises, and she outlined in her report her understanding of the requirements of the Act in relation to the application of sections 112 to 115.

Medical Officer of Health.

[10] The Medical Officer of Health had expressed concerns regarding the layout of the single area, specifically that:

- *Any shopper using the bakery or delicatessen area and taking a direct route to the checkouts would be required to pass through the alcohol area. Section 113(5)9b precludes this*
- *The spread-out nature of the alcohol area maximises rather than minimises exposure alcohol to shoppers*
- *One end of the alcohol area is very close to the checkout area and exposes alcohol to anyone in the checkout waiting area.*

[11] The applicant and agencies met to discuss those concerns and a revised layout plan was agreed upon and has been submitted with the application. This plan has not been implemented to date, but the change of single area will be made within three months of granting this application.

[12] The Medical Officer of Health did not oppose the application.

The legislation

[13] Under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 the application for renewal of a licence must be measured against a broader set of formulae as was the case under the previous, Sale of Liquor Act 1989.

[14] Section 131(1) of the Act sets out the relevant criteria to which we must have regard and specifically points to section 105(1) subsections (a) to (g), (j), and (k).

[15] When seeking to renew an off licence of the kind applied for here, a supermarket, section 132(1)(b) applies. This states that 'the licensing authority or the licensing committee concerned **MUST** (my emphasis) impose any conditions subject to which it must issue a licence of that kind'; ...

[16] This in effect brings the application under sections 112, 113, 114 and 115 of the Act.

[17] These sections detail the compulsory conditions relating to display, promotion and advertising of alcohol in a single area in supermarkets and grocery stores.

[18] At section 112(1) the purpose of these conditions is set out,

112 Compulsory conditions relating to display and promotion of alcohol in single area in supermarkets and grocery stores

- (1) *The purpose of this section and sections 113 and 114 is to limit (so far as is reasonably practical) the exposure of shoppers in supermarkets and grocery stores to displays and promotions of alcohol, and advertisements for alcohol.*

[19] This section places the renewal application, and the conditions which must be applied to it, in context.

Decision and reasons

- [20] As mentioned in the introduction the criteria when considering a renewal is set out in sections 132 and 105 of the Act.
- [21] There is no question as to the suitability of the applicant nor any other of the criteria with which I must have regard to in those sections.
- [22] Any area designated as a single area must promote both the object of the Act and the purpose, or intention, of the condition as set out at section 112(1).
- [23] The area as described by the applicant in their plan fits all the criteria. It is not in the area between the entrance and the main body of the premise and it is not in the area between the main body of the premises and the general point of sale.

Conclusion

- [24] I am are satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in sections 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 117, 105 and 106 of the Act and the licence renewal is granted for a period of 3 years pursuant to s.130, with the following conditions:
- (1) The single area shall be as defined in the plan which accompanied the licence application.
- [25] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory Conditions – section 116(2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) **No Alcohol may be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on ANZAC Day.**
- (b) **No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Easter Sunday unless the alcohol is grape wine or fruit or vegetable wine made on the premises.**
- (c) **Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours**
Monday to Sunday 7.30am to 10pm.
- (d) **No alcohol may be sold other than—**
(i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
(ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or

- (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (e) Only a single area as delineated on the attached plan is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol, for the premises will not take effect until three months after the issue of this licence .
- (f) Water must be freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

Conditions applying to all remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol:

- (a) The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the license holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site:
- (b) The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires.
- (c) A copy of the licence or a clearly identified link to such an image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age:
In the case of an order made using an internet site, telephone order, or physical order the prospective buyer must declare that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over) -
 - (i) once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
 - (ii) again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

Discretionary Conditions – section 116(1)

- (a) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (b) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:
 - Alcohol must only be sold, supplied within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.
- (c) the whole of the premises is undesigned.
