

What's a Community Board?

Community Boards are your local representatives. They work with your community to help meet local needs, goals and aspirations.

Each Community Board has a three-year plan outlining its priorities and guiding its decisions.

Each Community Board holds regular meetings that are open to the public and you're welcome to attend.

At these meetings, decisions are made on behalf of the Council on local issues, such as bus stops, pedestrian crossings, car parking and parks and reserves. The Boards also allocate funding to a wide range of community projects.

Board members are elected every three years at the local body elections.
