 Sense of Place 92% (n=443) enjoy living in their neighbourhood in Spreydon-Cashmere, the top reasons for this are: The natural environment and open spaces (50%, n=222) Venues, facilities and services are easy to access (36%, n=158) Easy access to a range of transport options (35%, n=156) 77% (n=368) are proud to be a resident of their neighbourhood. 57% (n=247) feel a sense of community with other people in their neighbourhood. Safety 90% (n=435) feel safe in their home after dark and walking in their neighbourhood during the day (95%, n=458). Facilities 81% (=391) are satisfied or very satisfied with the range of recreation, shopping and socialising opportunities in their neighbourhood. Volunteering 64% (n=299) have volunteered for groups or organisations in their wider community in the last 12 months, although 46% (n=217) say they have volunteered for their local community in the last 12 months. Community Attitudes 64% (n=275) agree or strongly agree that their neighbourhood has a positive future. Problem Assessment 78% (n=327) asy they are happy to work with others when they see a need within their neighbourhood. 	 Safety 56% (n=271) feel safe walking alone in their neighbourhood after dark, while 23% (n=110) feel neither safe nor unsafe. Participation Although 40% (n=190) agree or strongly agree that they attend community events in their neighbourhood, 26% (n=124) neither agree nor disagree that they do this, and 32% (n=150) disagree or strongly disagree. Problem Assessment 34% (n=144) agree or strongly agree that they have a good understanding of the needs of their neighbourhood, while 36% (n=152) neither agree nor disagree. Leadership 24% (n=106) agree or strongly agree that their community is addressing the most important issues affecting their neighbourhood, with 38% (n=172) neither agreeing nor disagreeing with this. Discrimination 15% (n=62) say they have been discriminated against in the last 12 months. 29% (n=18) say the discrimination happened at work. 47% (n=29) say they think they were discriminated against because of their gender.
