- [2] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141, accordingly I deal with the matter on papers.
- [3] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and pursuant to s.211(1)(c) the Committee's attitude to this application is that it should be granted, I hereby grant the applicant for a special licence pursuant to s.104(1).
- [4] The licence will not issue until all relevant clearances have been obtained. The applicant is not entitled to sell liquor until the licence issues.
- [5] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under s.46 to 63 and s.150.
- [6] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.
- [7] A **waiver** has been granted pursuant to s.208 of the Act in respect to the fact that the applicant has been granted an exemption to the provisions of s.213(1) and is not required to have a duty manager. Kirsty Allison has been nominated as a person to manage the conduct of the sale of alcohol under the licence.

- c) Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- d) Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.

DECISION 'ON THE PAPERS'

This application relates to an event to be held on Saturday 12 and Sunday 13 March 2016.

The event is Armageddon Christchurch and it is expected to be attended by approximately 15,000 people over 2 days. The applicant seeks to sell their range of products and offer free samples to those interested in their products.

Food will be available at this event.

A Managers has been appointed to supervise the sale and supply of alcohol at this event.

The Inspector has reported favourably in regard to the application.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1), accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and I grant the applicant a special licence pursuant to s.104 (1).

The licence will not issue until all relevant clearances have been obtained. The applicant is not entitled to sell liquor until the licence issues. Unlicensed sales can result in imprisonment for up to three months or a fine of \$40,000 (sec 233 (a) and (b) of the Act).

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63.

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory conditions- section 147(3)

Liquor will only be sold on the following day and times.

Saturday 12th March 2016 from 9.00am to 5.00pm the same day.

Sunday 13th March 2016 from 9.00am to 5.00pm the same day.

Signage must be displayed stating (directly or by description) a place or places on the premises at which drinking water is freely available to customers while the event described is taking place.

Discretionary conditions – section 147(1)

(a) The licence holder must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition of sales to intoxicated persons.

(b) A duty Manager must be on duty at all times and is responsible for compliance.

(d) Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.

(e) Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application by **Akaroa Cooking Limited** for a new On-Licence in respect of premises situated at **81 Beach Road, Akaroa**, known as '**The Akaroa Cooking School**'.

The general nature of the premise is that of a 'cooking school'.

No opposition or objections have been received regarding the application therefore I deal with the matters on the papers.

The premise has not previously been licenced and is sited the main street of the coastal village of Akaroa. It has traded as a 'cooking school' since 2009 and small tastings of wine have been served with each course during the day long cooking classes. It has not been until recently that the agencies became aware of this and advised the applicants that an on-licence was required.

Corporate groups attending cooking classes often bring their own alcohol. This was a concern of the Police and has been addressed by the applicant.

A waiver was sought under section 208 of the Act to allow a change to the hours of trade from those which were publically notified. The hours sought are at the suggestion of the agencies as they believe that the proposed hours better reflect the actual hours of trade of the premises. The hours originally sought in the application were 12.00pm to 9.00pm Monday to Sunday. The suggested hours are 10.00am to 10.00pm Monday to Sunday. These are not excessively changed and I do not believe

that any potential objector would have been prejudiced. I also do not believe the error was wilful, on the contrary it was the agencies who suggested the change.

The waiver is granted.

The owners of the applicant company are both 'hands on' in the running of the business. Two qualified managers have been appointed.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103.

No issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to sections 105 or 106 of the Act.

The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

A menu and Host Responsibility Policy were submitted with the application.

I am are satisfied as to the matters to which must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and I grant the licence for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory conditions – section 110 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No Alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on ANZAC Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold the following days and during the following hours when operated as a 'Cooking School':

Monday to Sunday 10.00am to 10.00pm.
- (c) Water will be freely available to customers on the premises while the premises are open for business.

Discretionary conditions – section 110 (1)

- (a) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

- (b) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:
- Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.
- (c) the following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
- The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their host responsibility policy aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.
- (d) the whole of the premises shall be undesignated.

This is an application by **186 Pityme Limited** for a new On-Licence in respect of premises situated at **186 Yaldhurst Road, Christchurch**, known as '**NO 186**'.

The general nature of the premise is that of a 'Restaurant'.

No opposition or objections have been received regarding the application therefore I deal with the matters on the papers.

The premise is currently licensed and is operating under a Temporary Authority it is a small restaurant close to a residential area. There have been no reported issues with the current licence under the Temporary Authority.

A waiver is sought under section 208 of the Act to allow a public notice with "second notice" to be regarded as the 'first notice'.

The first notice should have been published on the 6th of February 2016. There is no record of this having been done. A notice was published on the 13th of February 2016 but stated it was the second notice. Another public notice was published on the 20th of February 2016. This stated it was the first notice.

- [1] This is an application by **Phoenix Café & Bar Limited** for a new On-Licence in respect of premises situated at **237 Kilmore Street, Christchurch**, known as **'Boteco'**.
- [2] The general nature of the premise is that of a Café - Tavern.
- [3] No other matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103 accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [4] The applicant seeks conditions consistent with other on-licenses in the area.
- [5] The applicant company has one director-shareholder, Flavio Leonardo Dos Santos Porto. He intends to be 'hands on' in the running of the business. He will serve South American style food. Mr Porto has gained the Licence Controller Qualification and will apply for a manager's certificate. He has employed at least one qualified manager and intends to employ one more before opening, according to the Police.
- [6] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

- [7] The hours sought are in within the 'National Default Hours' and similar to other premises in the locality.
- [8] The application seeks licensed hours of Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 11.00pm, although the outside area may not be used after 7.00pm under the conditions of the resource consent.
- [9] The application submitted included a Host Responsibility Policy and menu. These are considered adequate. There was mention of training and staff meetings in the application but no additional material was included with the application. The applicant is reminded that the training of staff and regular staff training an important matter.
- [10] This is a new licence for a new building at a location which has not previously had a licensed premises on it. The site is adjacent to residential properties and therefore a resource consent was required. The consent was non-notified and has a number of conditions attached to it. The Inspector helpfully attached a copy of the resource consent conditions to the file.
- [11] Some of the conditions of the resource consent include
- A 1.8m high acoustic fence on the north and east boundaries of the site.
 - That the outdoor area is only available to patrons between 7.00am and 7.00pm weekdays and from 9.30am to 7.00pm on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays.
 - No use of any outside speakers after 7.00pm on any day and no use of any outdoor speakers before 9.30am on Saturdays, Sundays or Public Holidays.
 - No live music or amplified music in the external or internal spaces above background level.
 - A noise management plan is to be prepared for the activities prior to occupation and the plan shall include provisions relating to the management of noise from people and music from the activity as well as complaints procedures.
- [12] No issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to sections 105 or 106 of the Act apart from a comment in the Inspectors report where he responds to a question regarding section 105(1)(h), 'Will the good order and amenity of the locality likely be reduced, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of this licence?'. The Inspector stated *"This is difficult to forecast. The premises is located directly adjacent to residential properties so there is a potential for conflict. The premises has been established by way of a resource consent which has conditions attached also to ensure the premises does not unduly impact on the adjacent residential properties. Good management should minimise that potential. This has been discussed with the applicant. He has been advised that should any issues arise this could affect any future renewal"*.

- [13] Taking these comments into account the applicant is again advised that the management of the premises must be such that the premise does not reduce the good order and amenity of the area. Noise and general disturbance to the neighbourhood that may be attributed to the premise could affect the suitability of the applicant and therefore may create the situation that additional conditions may be placed on the licence or the licence renewal could be refused.
- [14] The applicant is also reminded that the conditions of the resource consent must be complied with and that non-compliance with any resource conditions may affect the suitability of the company holding the alcohol licence.
- [15] I am satisfied as to the matters to which must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and I grant the licence for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104 of the Act.

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application by **The Empire Hospitality Company Limited** for a new On-Licence in respect of premises situated at **172 St Asaph Street, Christchurch**, known as 'Empire'.

The general nature of the premise is that of a Tavern. It is located in the central city in the area designated for late night entertainment. There are a number of other bars in the vicinity. The building was previously a warehouse. The intent of the applicant is to open as a restaurant and bar between 4.00pm and 3.00am seven days a week but to extend the trading hours to include lunch service once established.

The applicants are experienced in the industry having owned and operated a number of taverns and venues in and around central Christchurch and Auckland. No matters have been raised by the agencies in their reports under s.103 and the application was duly advertised no public objections or notice of a desire to be heard have been received. Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

Four managers have already been appointed. There will be five managers appointed by the time the premises opens.

In her report the Alcohol Licensing Inspector states that "This is a new upmarket premises among other established bars and restaurants. Amenity and good order are

certainly an issue in this particular area at present, mainly from a younger age bracket. However the focus of this premises is for an older clientele and I do not foresee any concerns in relation to this particular premises in the future”.

The Inspector goes on to also state “I am aware of the concerns around nuisance and vandalism on St Asaph Street. This premises is next to Baretta, along from Valentino’s and Engineers and Merchants and across from Irishman Too. In short, they are among a small cluster of taverns, in a small area, on one street of Christchurch. However, the owners of this business are working alongside other licensee in the vicinity, to attempt to resolve issues already of concern with regards to their premises Baretta. They will work hard to avoid issues arising in the first instance and address any issues quickly to avoid conflict and ongoing concerns. In discussions with the applicant, I am impressed at how concerned they are to attempt to address problems with other licensees, attempting to foresee any issues in advance”.

From her report the Inspector makes it clear that there are issues in the area and that the licensee is attempting to mitigate these issues. An ongoing commitment will be necessary to address the issues in the area.

A detailed business plan and Alcohol Management Plan, along with a menu and host responsibility policy have been submitted with the application. This is commendable and shows a commitment to the matters highlighted in the Inspector’s report.

The applicants Alcohol Management Plan includes some initiatives including,

- A voluntary One Way Door policy from 2.00am (maybe instigated earlier)
- A one drink per person policy from 1.00am on more popular nights.
- Offering patrons lower alcohol beverage options after 1.00am.

As this is a new licence it is important that the applicant puts into place the commitments made in the application as the first year of any licence is seen as the ‘probationary year’ and at first renewal of the licence there is an opportunity for the agencies to assess the application in the light of trading history and if necessary recommend changes to the licence in their reports to the Committee. There is therefore a clear incentive for the applicant to put into action their intentions, as shown in their application.

I am are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act the licence is granted for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104. **The licence shall not issue until all matters under the Building Act have been complied with and a Certificate of Compliance or a Certificate of Public Use has been issued and a further two managers appointed for this premise.**

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application by **L & J Trading Limited** for a new On-Licence in respect of premises situated at **218 Marine Parade, Christchurch**, known as '**Spagalimis New Brighton**'.

The general nature of the premise is that of a Restaurant. It is located in a block of shops opposite the Pier in New Brighton amongst other restaurants and bars.

The application seeks conditions consistent with other on-licences in the area.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103 accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

The licence application results in the expiry of the original licence whilst the applicant had ownership of the business.

A new licence application was made in 2015 by the same applicant. This was refused by the District Licensing Committee after the matter was determined at a public hearing, decision number 60D [2015] 1860. The grounds of refusal were that the applicant was not suitable to hold a licence. In that decision the Committee stated;

(25) The submission from the Licensing Inspector raised concerns as to the applicant's suitability. We noted in the first hearing that the standard of the application documentation completed by Mr Lin was very poor. It has not improved since that time. It still does not adequately address the necessary requirements of an application, nor have the supporting documentation that would reasonably be required.

(26) We note that Mr Lin still does not hold a current manager's certificate, and to date has not yet applied for one. We also note that the required training at CPIT was not completed until the 8th of August. Eight days after the date all matters were required to be resolved.

(27) We are not satisfied that being "too busy" is sufficient reason to have not completed the requirements set down by this committee at the earlier hearing on the 21st of May 2015.

The Police and Medical Officer of Health both originally opposed this on-licence application on the grounds that the previous application had been refused and that in essence nothing had changed since then to show that he was now suitable.

A meeting was held between the applicant and the agencies. The applicant established that his wife will run the restaurant. She has sufficient experience and staff to do so without the agencies having concerns. It was also stated at the meeting that the applicant intends to sell the restaurant once it is licensed.

The Alcohol Licensing Inspector did not oppose the granting of this application and stated in her report, "However, even if this premises doesn't sell, there is no reason to believe it will not be managed in compliance with the Act and licence. It is a low risk restaurant with suitable staff and conservative hours. Furthermore, it's important to note, aside from the applicant not fully understanding the application process in 2015, he is suitable. If he hadn't allowed the licence to lapse, he would not be in this position".

The Police and Medical Officer of Health have, subsequent to the meeting with the applicant, withdrawn their opposition to this application.

No issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to sections 105 or 106 of the Act.

As the applicant has now been able to show his suitability to the agencies satisfaction, to the degree that they have withdrawn their opposition, I see no reason why the matter should not be dealt with on the papers and not be subject to another public hearing.

The applicant is reminded that his suitability is closely monitored during the first year of the licence, often referred to as the 'probationary year'. The agencies will again report on the licence when it comes up for renewal in 12 months' time. This should be an incentive for the applicant to maintain the confidence of the agencies by running the premises in compliance with the Act and his licence conditions.

The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

A waiver is sought under section 208 of the Act as the first public notice was published outside the prescribed period in section 127(3). The act was not wilful and I can see no reason why any potential objectors would be prejudiced. The waiver is granted.

I am are satisfied as to the matters to which must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and I grant the licence for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104.

- [7] The applicant also states that they will have security on the door and that they do not play loud music as they are a 'lounge bar'.
- [8] The premises is located to the immediate south of the central city. It has been fitted out as a café restaurant and is two distinct areas, café on one side and restaurant on the other.
- [9] The Alcohol Licensing Inspector states, "The applicant seeks an increase in the closing time to 3.00am the following day. No other changes have been sought. However in Christchurch I consider that any premises that trades later than 1.00am would no longer be operating as a restaurant only providing meals. My observations are past that time the emphasis changes from a focus on the sale of food to the sale of alcohol. For this reason I like all that operate after 1.00am to have a supervised designation from 10.00pm. This ensures unaccompanied minors are no longer on the premises which minimises them to potential risk. I have discussed this with the applicant who has agreed to a supervised designation between 10.00pm & 3.00am the following day".
- [10] The Inspector has no concerns regarding the variations to the licence.
- [11] The Police in their report stated that they did not oppose the application but stated, "However we would like to suggest applicant take part in the St Asaph Street Accord with a view of working with other local businesses to reduce the impact the bars and restaurants are having on the area".
- [12] I agree with the Police's suggestion and would encourage the applicant to actively participate in the accord.
- [13] A waiver is sought due to the public notice containing a misspelling of the premises name. The public notice also incorrectly states that the application is a new on-licence and does not contain the word variation and the original hours are not stated in the notice. Neither of these errors appear to be wilful and I can see no reason why a person who wished to object to the application would be prejudiced. A view of the application would clearly set these out. The waiver is granted.
- [14] The applicant needs to be aware, and I am sure the Inspector has pointed this out but I will emphasis this again, that when the hours of trade of a licensed premise are increased to later in the night there is a potential for an increase in alcohol related harm to occur. The main way of mitigating this by exemplary management. The licence has only been issued for 6 months so there are another 6 months before a renewal of the licence can be applied for. This gives the public and the reporting agencies the opportunity to have a say as to whether the licence should be renewed, or renewed without changes to the conditions of the licence.
- [15] The applicant must maintain high standards of management if they are to maintain the trust of the agencies, and this committee.
- [16] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and the variation to the hours of the licence, as well as the designation, are granted under section 120. The current licence, with these variations, continues to expire on the 9th day of October 2016.

(b) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises as specified in the application.
(c) A copy of this licence together with signs showing the age restrictions must be clearly displayed.
(d) Only the following kinds of alcohol may be sold from the premises: The licensees' own range of wine

The licence is also subject to the following conditions, which in the committee's opinion are not inconsistent with the Act:

Noise should be controlled so as not to disturb neighbouring residents.
