However in a decision dated 30th March 2017 the Committee drew attention to s41 of the Act which provides that a Special Licence should not be issued if it was more appropriate that an application be made for an On-Licence. The Committee while granting that application said that it thought the limit for Special Licences had been reached. On that occasion it also refused the applicants' request for exemption from s213(1), the requirement that at least one Duty Manager be appointed.

[4] Having thought it had made it clear that it considered any period of "testing the waters" to be over, the Committee was somewhat surprised to receive a further

application for a Special Licence for this venue. The intended function is to be in aid of a seriously ill person who is associated with the entertainment industry. There is no doubt that this is a worthy cause but it does not follow that the requirements of the Act designed to ensure the Object of the Act, that

(a) the sale, supply, and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly; and

(b) the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimized.

can be ignored. This application must be subject to the same rigorous scrutiny as any other. Regrettably it fails to stand up to that scrutiny.

[5] The NZ Police and the Medical Officer of Health both draw attention to the requirements of s41 and point out that this venue should be the subject of an application for an On-Licence. It is pertinent therefore to consider the matter of *NZ Equipment Ltd LLA 1366/95* where the then Liquor Licensing Authority said

"The issue of special licences in such circumstances is completely outside the purpose attributed to special licences in the legislation.....A special licence is not a mechanism enabling a new premise to commence general trading..."

This decision while made under the previous legislation is clearly relevant to the present situation. Once an application for an On Licence has been lodged further Special Licences relating to these premises should not be granted.

[6] If that were not enough, the Inspector's report on the venue under the heading "Amenity and Good Order Concerns" raises considerable doubt about its suitability for this type of event. The report is very comprehensive and encloses photographs of the site. I can only speculate that had this detailed information been available to the Committee which considered the previous applications then the outcome of those applications may well have been different. The site appears to be a rundown warehouse or similar which is dark and so constructed as to create areas which would be difficult to supervise. Questions must arise about fire and general safety and no doubt these issues will need to be addressed in a Resource Consent application before an alcohol licence can even be considered. The environs of the premises are rough and littered with discarded pieces of concrete and other building materials as well as

some seemingly abandoned motor parts and other rubbish. The general area is dark and would be hard to find by emergency services if required.

[7] No doubt with these concerns in mind the Inspector has discussed the proposed hours with the applicants who originally sought 1 pm to 1 am the following day. On consideration they have reduced these to 1 pm to 7 pm. That certainly mitigates some risk. However sunset on the 6th May 2017 will be at 5.25 pm which means that patrons leaving the premises in the last hour and a half of the event or later will still have to traverse dark and unsafe areas to reach their vehicles or public transport. Adjacent streets are poorly lit and one, Cumnor Terrace, borders the Heathcote River which is not well fenced and masked by trees and undergrowth at this point.

[8]Having considered the criteria I am required to take account of, as set out in s142(1), then taken a step back to consider the entire application against the Object of the Act as set out in s4, I am satisfied that this application should not be granted. That is the case even if it met the requirements of the legislation which I seriously doubt given the provisions of s41. Despite none of the Reporting Agencies actually reporting in opposition under s141, s144 provides that a licensing committee may refuse to issue a special licence of its own motion. In my view that is the only appropriate course of action.

DECISION

[9] The application of Tigga Design Ltd for a Special Licence for a function on 6th May 2017 is refused.
