## **DECISION ON THE PAPERS**

- [1] This is an application by **Bog Dunedin Limited** for a new On-Licence in respect of premises situated at **76 Hereford Street**, **Christchurch**, known as **'Original Sin'**.
- [2] The application was originally made in the name of a holding company. Correspondence has since been received from the applicant asking that the application be amended to the Bog Dunedin Limited.
- [3] The Alcohol Licensing Inspector sent the Committee a supplementary report outlining the change and suggesting that as the directors, and some of the shareholders, are the same that there is no prejudicial effect on any potential objectors and therefore there should be no need to further publicly notify the application.
- [4] The Inspector also reports that she has discussed the matter with both the Police and Medical Officer of Health and they have no concerns and are not of a mind to furnish a further report.
- [5] I agree with the Inspector and do not believe that any persons who have a greater interest than the public generally would be prejudiced. A waiver is granted pursuant to s. 208 of the Act in relation to the applicant being required to publicly notify the new entity in this application.
- [6] The general nature of the premise is to be that of a Tavern. The applicant seeks terms and conditions that are consistent with an on licence for the area.

- [7] The building is located in the central city in an area designated for late night entertainment.
- [8] The application was duly advertised and no public objection, or notice of desire to be heard, has been received. The Medical Officer of Health originally opposed the application due to a lack of information but the opposition has since been withdrawn as further information has been disclosed by the applicant. No matters were raised in opposition by the Police or Licencing Inspector in their reports, therefore I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [9] This is the first application for a premise in the new entertainment area known as 'The Terrace'. Before the Christchurch Earthquakes this area was colloquially known as 'The Strip'. All the damaged buildings in the area have been demolished and the premise is part of a large complex covering three street frontages and at least half an inner city block. There are likely to be a number of licenced premises in this location.
- [10] The premise is still under construction and awaiting final fit-out. It has three separate licenced areas. Each have a separate entrance therefore each entrance will display signage and a copy of the licence. All parts of the premises shall be covered by one licence.
- [11] The premises covers two floors and has an area on the ground floor which is leased from the Christchurch City Council (footpath lease) and includes an outdoor dining area. This area fronts Oxford Terrace and has a view over the Avon River. The second floor has outdoor decking on two sides, one facing Oxford Terrace and the other Hereford Street. These outdoor areas could create noise issues and are covered by the Noise Management Plan. A noise assessment report was commissioned by the applicant and was placed on the file. Noise from the outside areas and amplified noise from within the building are identified as issues. Part of the mitigation for noise escape is the closing of doors after a set time in the evening.
- [12] The applicant in this matter runs a number of premises in Christchurch and also in other parts of the South Island. They are a very experienced operator. They intend to engage an experienced security operator for the premises.
- [13] The premise is subject to a number of resource consent conditions applicable to noise.
- [14] The final application contains a large number of documents and includes a Noise Management Plan (and Noise Assessment Report), Alcohol Management Plan (Including a Queue Management Plan) and staff training documents. These documents are comprehensive and should be read as undertakings.
- [15] Along with the management plans mentioned above the Inspector states that the applicant has made a further undertaking in regards to the provision of reticulated water at every bar.

- [16] A Host responsibility Policy and menus are included in the file and are appropriate for the style of premise.
- [17] No issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to sections 105 or 106 of the Act.
- [18] The hours sought are Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 3.00am the following day. A supervised designation for the whole premises is sought after 9.00pm. The hours and designation are appropriate for this type of operation.
- [19] The Alcohol Licensing Inspector, in her comprehensive report, states that the applicant has two other licensed premises in Christchurch and a further one in Dunedin. The two Christchurch premises were the subject of "intensive monitoring" and a warning letter was issued in 2014 and further concerns were raised in 2016. She goes on to state that the applicant has "taken on board some valuable learnings from these premises which are located in a similar high risk precinct".
- [20] It appears from the Inspector's report that there have been no issues involving the premises for close to twelve months.
- [21] Further in the Inspector's report she states' "Fat Eddies etc is located within the city's newest and most sought after hospitality area. All eyes are on The Terrace. The agencies expect the premises to be busy and to be tested by its patrons for at least six months after opening. When I say 'tested' I mean younger people will be looking for what they can get away with. What is tolerated? The agencies will be monitoring this premises, and all premises in the area, closely. This precinct is at the forefront of hospitality in Christchurch and we all need it to perform well. It will be in the media spotlight. I note that these experienced licensees have received a very generous graduated response from the agencies at both of their Christchurch premises in recent years. The licensee should apply these learnings and experience to the operations at this new premises. The applicant has provided good information as part of this application to show the agencies and Committee how this premises will be managed to ensure compliance with the object of the Act. There is a good Alcohol management Plan and a high level of staff training. If management practices do not reflect the intentions stated in this application then enforcement action could be the only realistic option."
- [22] The Committee records the Inspector's comments as an encouragement to the applicant to continue on the continuum of improvement and set a high standard for other premises to follow. The Committee also records that within the documents placed on the file by the Inspector, are a number of alleged offences which may have been committed by the applicant at their other premises, primarily at 'The Bog'. These are alleged breaches of the Act that have not been tested by either The Authority, or a Committee, therefore I have not commented on these matters further apart from my previous comment regarding an encouragement to continue to improve.

[23] In regards to the intentions of the applicant the Committee takes note of the contents of an email on file where a director of the applicant company, Max Bremner, states to the agencies,

"The opening of 76 Hereford St or "Original Sin" "Kong" and "Fat Eddies" marks a unique time in the Christchurch rebuild. The investment by the Council, property owners, and individual hospitality tenants is considerable and we have to set the standards from the start. We are in a situation in that we are basically opening Christchurch's entertainment precinct, the much promoted in the media "The Terrace". With this the majority of people that will be attracted will be coming back to town for the first time since the earthquakes and these will be the older more affluent. WE have to make it a safe comfortable environment that will attract these people back and also appeal to the tourism sector that will undoubtedly come with time.

We are all of the same opinion that we have to put systems in place to avoid some of the problems that have arisen in other hospitality hotspots in the past 5 or 6 years".

...."Effectively we have no interest in moving the younger, pre-loaded, arriving at 11pm type patron from other parts of town. We realise that it is not the police that should be policing the area it falls on us and responsibility for the type of crowd we get s totally up to us...."

......*"....This is only the start but we are all committed to achieving the same result and getting it right which I believe is vital for Christchurch and "The Terrace".* 

- [24] The Committee acknowledges that Christchurch is still rebuilding from the devastating earthquakes of 2010 and 2011 and that the regeneration of a safe night-time economy is a partnership between the hospitality industry, the agencies and local government. It is encouraging that the applicant acknowledges this and has been working with the agencies, and Council, to try and start this new development by seeking to set a high benchmark for industry to follow.
- [25] I am are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act the licence is granted for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104. The licence shall not issue until all matters under the Building Act have been complied with and a Certificate of Compliance or a Certificate of Public Use has been issued as well as a final inspection by the Alcohol Licensing Inspector.
- [26] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).
- [27] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.
- [28] The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

### Compulsory conditions – section 110 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No Alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on ANZAC Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.

- [4] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 129 accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [5] The applicant seeks renewal with the same terms and conditions as the licence currently in force at the premises.
- [6] The club has one manager currently appointed.
- [7] A menu and Host Responsibility Policy were included with the application.
- [8] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act and the licence is granted for a period of 3 year pursuant to s.122 of the Act.

[9] The applicant is reminded of their obligations under s.60 of the Act in regards to who the club is authorised to sell and allow to consume alcohol on their premises.

Under section 60 a club licence authorises the sale and supply of alcohol on the premises to "Authorised Customers":

Any member of the club; or

Any person who is a guest on the premises at the invitation of, and is accompanied by, a member of the club; or

Any member of some other club with which the club has an arrangement for reciprocal visiting rights for members (authorised visitors)

A member, in relation to a club, means a person who -

Has expressly agreed in writing to comply with the club's rules; and Is recognised as a member of the club by those rules.

- [10] The applicant is also reminded that no BYO is permitted in clubs under section 62. The holder of the licence must ensure that, while the premises is open for the sale and supply of alcohol, no person consumes on the premises any alcohol not sold and supplied on the premises by the licensee.
- [11] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1),
- [12] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.

[13] The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory conditions - section 110 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

Alcohol is authorised for the consumption on the premises, to

- (a) (i) Any authorised customer; or
  - (ii) Any person who is on the premises at the invitation of an authorised visitor who is also on the premises.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold the following days and during the following hours the premises are operating as a Club:

Monday to Friday4.00pm to 10.00pmSaturday and Sunday12 noon to 10.00pm

(c) Water will be freely available to customers on the premises while the premises are open for business.

### Discretionary conditions - section 110 (1)

- (a) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
  - Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
  - The holder of a club licence must ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied to any person for consumption on the premises unless the person is an authorised customer.
- (b) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:
- Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

(c) the following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:

• The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their host responsibility policy aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.

Other restrictions and requirements

Section 51 - Non-alcoholic drinks to be available

Section 52 – Low alcoholic drinks to be available

Section 53 – Food to be available

Section 54 – Help with information about transport to be available

Section 57 – Display of licences

Section 60 – Sale and supply in clubs to members and guests only.

Section 61 – Administrative requirements for clubs.

Section 62 – No bring your own alcohol in clubs.

Section 214(2) to (4) – Manager to be responsible for compliance.

A copy of the licence setting out the conditions to which it is subject is attached to this decision.
