DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR NEW ON - LICENCE

[1] This is an application by TCS Events Limited ('the applicant') for an On-Licence under s99 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ('the Act') in respect of premises situated at 314 Cashel Street, Christchurch, known as The Corner Store.

[2] The general nature of the premises is that of an event space/gallery. The premises is currently unlicensed. The applicant seeks that the licence be granted on terms and conditions consistent with an on licence for the area.

[3] The application was received by Christchurch District Licensing on 3 May 2018. The application was publicly notified on the Council website on 4 May 2018 with the objection period finishing on 28 May 2018. One objection was received within the notice period. The objector owns and occupies a neighbouring business and raised concerns about noise, disorderly behaviour and security.¹

[4] The applicant met with the objector and the Agencies. An agreement was reached whereby the applicant would reduce their hours to close at 12pm, provide a noise management plan, manage parking and improve security. The applicant agreed to those measures in writing ('agreed measures').² The agreed measures include:

- (a) Clearly advertise in marketing material carparking on Cashel Street and Clarkson Avenue, not neighbouring businesses carparks.
- (b) Traffic control measures and security to manage carparking.
- (c) Employment of security guards for functions extending beyond 9pm (excluding standard gallery operations and dinner service).
- (d) Installation of security measures.
- (e) Adhere to a Noise Management Plan and not playing music outside after 9pm

[5] The NZ Police and the Medical Officer for Health are not opposed to the application. The Medical Officer for Health noted that as long as the applicant complied with the matters agreed with the objector, then there were no matters to report.

[6] The Inspectors Report sets out the background to the application and addresses the matters to which regard is to be had in section 105 and 106 of the Act.³ The Inspector recommends the grant of the on licence for 12 months subject to conditions.

[7] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required by s.103 of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.⁴

[8] Although the objector has withdrawn I have taken into consideration the agreed measures to ensure good order and amenity of the area. I have included a condition requiring adherence to the Noise Management Plan submitted by the applicant, that includes a restriction to outside music to 9pm. That is because those measures are sufficiently certain, within the applicants control and enforceable. In terms of the remaining agreed measures I have treated these as the applicant's undertakings which should be reviewed upon renewal of the licence to ensure that the applicant's licensed activities are not causing a nuisance to neighbouring property owners. The applicant and the Inspector agree to a condition to adhere to the Noise Management Plan.

[9] I am satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before me and having had regard to the criteria as set out in s.105 (and informed by s106) of the Act that the granting the application subject to conditions achieves the purpose and objects of the Act.

[10] Accordingly, pursuant to s.104(1) of the Act I grant the application for an Onlicence for a period of 12 months subject to the following conditions:

The Licensed Premises

(a) The premises are identified on the plan provided with the application for a licence.

Discretionary conditions – section 110 (1)

- (b) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (c) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:

 Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

Compulsory conditions – section 110 (2)

- (d) No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
- (e) Alcohol may only be sold the following days and during the following hours when the premises are being operated as a Restaurant:
 - (i) Monday to Sunday, between the hours of 8 am to 12pm.
- (f) Water will be freely available to customers on the premises while the premises are open for business.

Section 117 – Other Discretionary conditions

- (g) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - (i) The licence must implement and maintain the steps proposed in The Corner Store Host Responsibility Policy⁵ aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.
- (h) The licensee must comply with the Noise Management Plan submitted with the application including the requirement that music played outdoors shall cease at 9pm.

 The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area from 9pm to 12pm.

- (m) Section 54 Help with information about transport to be available
- (n) Section 56 Display of signs

- (p) Section 214 Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

[12] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under the Act. Specifically, s.46 to 63 and 231 (1). The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.

DECISION 'ON THE PAPERS'

[1] This is an application by **Paint N Sip Studio NZ (2018) Limited** for a Temporary Authority for an On-licence made under section 136 of the Act in respect of premises known as **Paint N Sip Studio**, located at **136 llam Road**, **Christchurch**, and trading under On-licence number 060/ON/183/2015. The licence being current until 12 August 2018.

[2] The granting of a Temporary Authority is governed by s.136 of The Act and outlines the criteria for the making of an order authorising the applicant to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol for a period not exceeding 3 months.

[3] The Inspector's report confirms that the applicant has tenure for the premises.

[4] There is no opposition from the Licensing Inspector or the Police.

[5] The granting of Temporary Authorities is based on the premise that they are 'Temporary' and are a vehicle to allow the applicant time to apply for a permanent licence. The applicant should be aware that it is the opinion of this Committee that a substantive licence application should be submitted to the Committee within six weeks. If there are legitimate reasons for a delay then the time may be extended but the question of suitability could be raised if an application is not submitted in a timely fashion. [6] We are satisfied as to the matters we must have regards to, as set out in section 136 of The Act. We therefore grant the Temporary Authority and it can be issued immediately for a 3 month period or until determined by the Christchurch District Licensing Committee.

[7] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.136(5) of the Act where it states that they carry "the same duties, obligations, and liabilities as the holder of the On-licence and also to s.110(2)(c) of the Act in relation to the condition of the licence that "drinking water is to be freely available to customers while the premises are open for business".

DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF ON- LICENCE

[1] This is an application by MC Christchurch Holdings Limited ('the applicant') for a renewal of an On-Licence pursuant to s129 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ('the Act') in respect of premises situated at 764 Colombo Street, Christchurch, known as Crown Plaza Christchurch. The premises operate under an existing licence, which expires on 30 June 2018.¹

[2] The general nature of the premise is that of a hotel.

[3] The application was received by Christchurch District Licensing on 18 April 2018. The application was publicly notified on 18 April 2018. No objections were received.

[4] There is no objection from the NZ Police and from the Medical Officer for Health. The Inspectors Report sets out the background to the application and addresses the matters to which regard is to be had in section 105, 106 and 131 of the Act.² The Inspector recommends the grant of the renewal for an on licence for 3 years subject to conditions.

[5] The Inspector has requested a waiver pursuant to s208 of the Act. The reason for the waiver is that an amendment has been made to the licensed area after the application was notified on the Council website. A change was also made to the designation. The Inspector noted that the applicant had obtained a licence from the Council to occupy the footpath outside the hotel for the purpose of dining and consuming beverages. The Inspector alerted the applicant that the area concerned is outside the licensed area identified on the existing licence, and that the applicant may wish to include the area. The applicant confirmed that they did wish to include the area. The public notice did not mention the amendment to the licensed area.

[6] I questioned the Inspector as to whether it was appropriate to grant a waiver in circumstances where the licensed area was being altered or whether it was more appropriate to renotify the application. I asked for more detail to support the grounds for a waiver under s208. The Inspector responded that the applicant had used the footpath outside as an unlicensed area since obtaining a license to occupy the footpath from the Council in July 2017. The Inspector also submitted that in relation to an application for waiver:³

When taking into account a request for a waiver in relation to public notices the type of license, nature of operation, compliance concerns, location and complaints are all taken into account. For a premises such as this where there are no concerns, the location is well known established premises to those who visit and work in the area, and it would be extremely unlikely to attract an objection (in my experience a premises such as this has never attracted an objection), and I do not believe anyone has been prejudiced by the omission in the public notice or that the omission was wilful.

[7] The Inspector also noted:

It is also not uncommon that an applicant choses to vary conditions after public notices have been displayed. This is because the agencies discuss the application with the applicant and changes may come about at that time, for example a change to a designation as the manner in which the premises operates has changed.

[8] The power to grant a waiver for any omission is not a general power to make any amendment to an application. While it may be a common occurrence for an application to change after it is notified, following discussion between an applicant and the Agencies, care still needs to be taken to ensure that any changes to conditions which alter the scope of the application as originally notified are properly made with notice. A person with an interest greater than the public generally is entitled to rely on the public notice to ascertain their interest. An increase in the licensed area (especially outside of the building footprint) have the potential to impact on a would-be objector.

[9] In this case, I note that the amendment to the licensed area incorporated a small area which was already used by the applicant as an unlicensed area, was authorised by the Council pursuant to a licence to occupy and the use of the licensed premises is well known. It is unlikely to have prejudiced any would be objector. It appears that the failure to identify the amendment was not wilful. Taking into consideration those factors I grant the waiver to include the footpath area and amend the designation.

[10] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required by s.103 of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.⁴

[11] I am satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before me and having had regard to the criteria as set out in s.105 (and informed by s106) and s131 of the Act that the granting the application subject to conditions achieves the purpose and objects of the Act.

[12] Accordingly, pursuant to s.130(1) of the Act I grant the application for a renewal of the On-licence for a period of 3 years subject to the following conditions:

DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF ON AND OFF - LICENCE

[1] This is an application by Takamatua Valley Vineyards Limited ('the applicant') for a renewal of an On-Licence and Off-Licence pursuant to s129 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ('the Act') in respect of premises situated at 59 Long Bay Road, Christchurch, known as Akaroa Winery. The premises operate under existing on and off licences, which expired on 21 December 2017¹

[2] The general nature of the premise is that of a winery.

[3] The application was received by Christchurch District Licensing on 24 November 2017. The application was publicly notified on 6 December 2018. No objections were received.

[4] There has been some delay in processing the application due to the applicant having let his managers certificate lapse. The business had been closed for some time due to earthquake repairs. Once this matter was brought to the applicant's attention the situation was rectified. There is no objection from the NZ Police and from the Medical Officer for Health. The Inspectors Report sets out the background to the application and addresses the matters to which regard is to be had in section 105, 106 and 131 of the Act.² The Inspector recommends the grant of the renewal for an on licence for 3 years subject to conditions.

[5] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required by s.103 of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.³

[6] Looking at the application and the correspondence between the applicant, the Inspector and in correspondence from the Medical Officer for Health, there appeared to be a lack of certainty as to what food the applicant will provide on-site (apart from catered events where menus are provided). There is some mention of crackers, breadsticks and local cheese for wine tastings in email correspondence. For the applicant's reference they will need to ensure that a reasonable range of food is available whenever alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises in accordance with s53 of the Act.

[7] There was also a lack of clarity with respect to the extent of the licensed area. The Inspector referred to outdoor areas in her report, however, the plan accompanying the application did not appear to show these. Following further investigation, the Inspector provided an updated aerial photograph with the extent of the licensed areas identified by a dark line.⁴ The licensed area includes the terrace and grassed area which is used for functions from time to time. It appears that these areas were always understood to have been included in the licensed area, however, the site plan had never clearly identified these. That has now been rectified. The Medical Officer for Health and the NZ Police have no concerns regarding this clarification.

DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR MANGERS CERTIFICATE

DECISION 'ON THE PAPERS'

- [1] This decision includes 15 applicants who are all participants in 'The Square Winter Ale Festival' and an overall licence which will be held by the organiser of the event, Canterbury Beer Festival Co. The applicants seek On licences to sell each applicant's own range of alcoholic products from stalls at a large scale event proposed to be held in Cathedral Square, Christchurch and scheduled to take place on Saturday 7 July 2018 from 3.00pm to 9.30pm.
- [2] A schedule of applicants, and their respective managers, is attached to this decision. Waivers are sought by some applicants to allow other than a qualified manager of oversee the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol. These are granted and the responsible persons shall be those as per the attached schedule.
- [3] The applicants are manufacturers, distributors, importers, or wholesalers of alcohol for sale for consumption off their premises and consumed off site. This permits samples to be provided free of charge on their premises.
- [4] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1), accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [5] The application states that up to 2,000 people are expected to attend the event. This is an annual event which has previously been held at the Rolleston Community Centre in the Selwyn District and it has now grown to a point where a larger venue is required.
- [6] A site plan and overall Alcohol Management Plan has been provided. An event permit has been issued for this event by the Christchurch City council.
- [7] The Alcohol Management Plan shall be read as conditions of the licence.

- [8] Qualified managers have been appointed, as per the attached schedule, and will oversee the sale of alcohol. An overall manager has been appointed by the organiser. A restricted designation is sought. This is appropriate for this type of event.
- [9] The event area will be fully fenced and entry strictly controlled and nine food stalls will also be located conveniently within the site.
- [10] All ticket holders will be identified and wrist banded, anyone sighted without a wrist band will be required to leave. Minors are not permitted on site.
- [11]Entrants will be issued with a 350ml polycarbonate glass on arrival and tasting pours will be 100ml. Free water will be provided at each stall in addition there will be four water stations distributed around the site (as per the plan provided). Security will also be present and manage entry, behaviour on site, and ongoing intoxication levels.
- [12]Four bands will provide entertainment as will a Japanese drummer, and professional entertainers. It is also hoped to have snow brought in for a snow sculpture competition.
- [13] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and I grant the applicant a special licence pursuant to s.104(1).

[5] The licence will not issue until all relevant clearances have been obtained and the applicant is not entitled to sell alcohol until the licence issues. The applicant's attention is drawn to s259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under s46 to s63. The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

[6]The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

Compulsory Conditions – s147(3)

The following conditions are compulsory:

(a) Alcohol may only be sold under the licence on the following days and during the following hours:

Thursday 28th June 2018 between the hours of 4 pm and 8 pm.

(b) Drinking water must be freely available on the premises as specified in the application.

Discretionary Conditions – s147(1)

The following discretionary conditions apply-

- (a) The licence holder must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory requirements on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (b) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as specified in the application.
- (c) Low alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (d) Non alcoholic beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (e) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises as specified in the application.
- (f) A copy of this licence together with signs showing the age restriction must be clearly displayed.
- (g) Entry is restricted to invited guests only.

<u>The licence is also subject to the following conditions which in the Committee's opinion are</u> not inconsistent with the Act

(a) Noise should be controlled so as not to disturb neighbouring residents.
