DECISION ON THE PAPERS

- [1] This is an application by **Bomb Bucha Limited** for an Off-Licence with an endorsement for remote sales in respect of premises situated at **17 Sir James Wattie Drive, Christchurch**, known as **Bomb Bucha**.
- [2] The general nature of the premise is that of a **remote sellers of alcohol**.
- [3] The application was received by Christchurch District Licensing Committee on 25 February 2020, we are satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard to as set out in s.105.
- [4] The application was duly advertised and three public objections were received; there were no notices of desire to be heard. Pursuant to s.211(1)(c), the Committee is obliged to consider the status of those objectors pursuant to s.102(1):
 - "A person may object to the granting of a licence only if he she has a greater interest in the application for the licence than the public generally."

The question of status needs to be considered before we can move on to the merits of any other matters. Of the three objectors, one lived 13.5 kilometres away from the proposed premises, the second lives in the Wellington area and the third lives in the Auckland area.

- [5] Some objectors mentioned that as this was an application for an Off-licence for remote sales that their location, in related to the proposed licensed premises should not be considered, as a bar to them not being able to be an objector as location is not mentioned in s.102(1).
- [6] The Committee fails to see the logic in that as 102(1) applies to all the licenses under the Act and Alcohol Regulatory Licensing Authority (ARLA) has held it is a consideration in all cases. The most relevant to this matter being the cases:

GDR Trading Limited v Communities Against Alcohol Harm Inc {2019} NZARLA 222 Gisborne Liquormart Limited v Ka Pai Kaiti Trust, [2018] NZARLA 316

In GDR Trading Limited, para [59] ARLA went on to say that "here, as in Gisborne Liquormart, it is not sufficient for CAAH to be a responsible public interest group. CAAH's interest must not only be greater than that of the public generally, but CAAH must have an interest greater than that of the public in respect of this particular application". What needs to be established is that CAAH will be affected in some way by the grant of the application." We note that the case cited is a different factual situation but nevertheless we believe it is relevant to this matter.

- [7] The Committee after due consideration concluded that the three objectors do not have an interest greater than the public generally based on their geographical location and therefore, they do not qualify as parties to this application.
- [8] Therefore the Committee's attitude to this application is that it should be granted, we hereby grant the applicant for an Off-licence pursuant to s.104(1).
- [9] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by s.103 accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers. The Committee is mindful of the lack of opposition from the Medical Officer of Health and the New Zealand Police that it is as ARLA pointed out in the GDR Trading Decision, it is the Act that has mandated these organisations to represent aspects of public interest.
- [10] The Committee notes the comments of the Medical Officer of Health (MOH) and while the MOH did not oppose the application it did raise a number of matters to assist the Committee in its deliberations. These matters were considered by the Committee and a condition limiting the licence to "Bomb Bucha" sales only, as suggested by both MOH and the Inspector has been included.
- [11] No other issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to s 105 of the Act.
- [12] We are satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before us that the application fulfils the criteria as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and does not offend against either the purpose or object of the Act. Pursuant to s.211(1)(c) the Committee's attitude to this application is therefore that it should be granted, we hereby grant the application for an Off-licence pursuant to s.104(1) for the period of 1 year.

- [13] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically s.46 to 63 and 231 (1).
- [14] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.
- [15] The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Endorsement (Remote Sellers of alcohol)

Section 40 of the Act applies to the licence, the licensee is authorised to sell alcohol from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

Subject to the licence not being issue before:

(a) Inspection by the Inspectorate for confirmation of website design and compliance.

Compulsory conditions - section 116 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours:

Anytime on any day

Under s. 59(1) Delivery to the buyer is not permitted any time after 11.00 pm on any day and before 6.00 am on the next day.

(c) Water must be freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

Other discretionary conditions section 116 (1)

(a) Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

Section 117 - Other discretionary conditions

- (a) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:
 - Alcohol must only be sold and supplied on the premises within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.
 - The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their host responsibly policy aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.
 - An undertaking applies to this application. The applicant has agreed in writing to only sell their own Bomb Bucha product that they have had manufactured by their supplier.
 - · No direct sales may be made.

Conditions applying to all remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol:

(a) The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the licence holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site.

The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires.

- (b) A copy of the licence or a clearly identified link to such image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- (c) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age: In the case of an order made using an internet site, telephone order, or physical order -The prospective buyer must declare that he is she is 18 years of ag or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)-
 - (i) Once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
 - (ii) Again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

Other restrictions and requirements

Section 59 – Requirements relating to remote sales by holders of off-licences. Section 212 – Appointment of Managers.

A copy of the licence setting out the conditions to which it is subject is attached to this decision. The licence shall be issued for 1 year.
