- This is an application by **Winnie Bagoes City Limited** ('the applicant") for renewal of an On-Licence pursuant to s.99 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ("the Act") for premises known as **Winnie Bagoes City** situated at 40 Welles Street, Christchurch.
- [2] The premises are in the nature of a Tavern.
- [3] The application was duly advertised and no public objections or notice of desire to be heard have been received.
- [4] The New Zealand Police and the Medical Officer of Health are not opposed to the application.
- [5] The Inspector's Report sets out the background to the application and addresses matters to which regard is to be had in sections 105 and 106 of the Act. The Inspector recommends the grant of the licence for three years subject to conditions.
- [6] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required under s.103 of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.²

- [7] Upon receiving the application I noted, via a minute, the application appeared to indicate it was an application for a restaurant rather than a tavern style on-licence. But if it was a tavern then I believed the following applied:
 - Should the applicant wish to proceed with the renewal of an on-licence application for a Tavern then section 119 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 requires that the whole or part of the premises will need to be designated in accordance with s119(3). I note the Inspector has assessed the application as a Tavern and recommended a condition whereby the designation commences at 9pm, which would leave the premises undesignated at all other times which on the face of it may not be permitted by s119(3), if in fact the premises is a Tavern.
- [8] The applicant clearly believed that his operation was operating as a tavern and I accept this. The applicant indicated that like similar hospitality businesses, Winnie Bagoes morphed from a restaurant during the day to a tavern in the evenings.
- [9] A second minute was written outlining the correspondence to date and seeking confirmation from the applicant that he accepts that s119 shall apply to the premises. The applicant accepted the situation and supplied a revised plan showing the area to be designated as supervised whenever the premises are open for business. The whole premises will be designated after 9.00 pm.
- [10] The Tri-Agencies all agreed with the above solution should a licence be issued.
- [11] I am satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before me and having had regard to the criteria as set out in s.105 (and informed by s.106) of the Act that granting the application subject to conditions achieves the purpose and objects of the Act.
- [12] Accordingly, pursuant to s.1301) of the Act I grant the application for an On-licence renewal, with the amendments outlined above, for a period of three years subject to the following conditions:

The Licensed Premises

(a) The premises are identified on the amended plan provided by the applicant.³

Section 110 (1) Discretionary Conditions

- (a) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition of sales to intoxicated persons.

- (b) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises are concerned:
 - Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed in the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

- (b) Alcohol may only be sold and supplied on the following days and during the following hours when the premises are being operated as a Tavern:

Monday to Sunday 8.00 am to 2.00 am the following day.

(c) Water must be freely available to customers at all times while the premises are open for business.

Section 117 Other discretionary conditions

- (a) The following steps must be taken to promote the reasonable consumption of alcohol:
 - The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in its Host Responsibility Policy⁴ aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.

Section 119 – Restricted or supervised areas

- The area marked on the revised plan in pink (currently the area with bar leaners) shall be designated as supervised at all times. For the sake of clarification, the 'revised plan' refers to that plan supplied by the applicant via email on September 22 2020.
- The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area after 9.00 pm.

 - (i) Once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
 - (ii) Again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

- [6] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required by s.141(1) of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.²

The applicant has appointed Gem Theola Saitaga as the duty manager (60/CERT/889/2016) who has experience running this event and other large scale licenced events in the past. Other certified managers (approximately 25) will be provided for each bar area and roaming managers within the Public Village, Public Trackside Lawn and Lindauer Lawn in groups. Security personnel experienced in licencing industry operations will also be in attendance.
- [5] The NZ Police and the Medical Officer of Health are not opposed to the application.
- [6] The Inspectors Report sets out the background to the application and addresses the matters to which regard is to be had in section 142 of the Act.³ The Inspector recommends the grant of the special licence for the event subject to conditions.




