## **DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR NEW OFF-LICENCE**

- [1] This is an application by Mediterranean Food South Island Limited ('the applicant') for a new Off-Licence pursuant to s129 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ('the Act') in respect of premises situated at 100 Oxford Terrace, Christchurch, known as Mediterranean Food Co.
- [2] The premises is new and will be established in a new development to be known as Riverside Farmers Market in Central Christchurch.
- [3] The general nature of the premise is that of a grocery store specialising in Mediterranean foods with wine and beer sales.
- [4] The application was received by Christchurch District Licensing on 5<sup>th</sup> August 2019. The application was publicly notified from 6<sup>th</sup> August 2019. No objections were received.
- [5] There is no objection from the NZ Police and from the Medial Officer for Health. The Inspector's Report sets out the background to the application and addresses

the matters to which regard is to be had in section 105, 106 of the Act.<sup>1</sup> The Inspector recommends the grant of the off licence for 12 months subject to conditions.

- [6] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required by s.103 of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.<sup>2</sup>
- [7] I have carefully considered the context of the SAA and the requirements for a SAA as set out in the *Haslar* decision.<sup>3</sup>
- [8] I accept and agree with the assessment made by the Inspector and accept his recommendation. That is because in approving the SAA in the attached plan, I am satisfied that the area described limits (so far as is reasonably practicable) the exposure of shoppers at the premises to displays and promotion of alcohol, and advertisements of alcohol. The SAA is at the rear of the store, so I am satisfied that the SAA meets the requirements of s113 of the Act.
- [9] I am satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before me and having had regard to the criteria as set out in s.105 (and informed by s106) of the Act that the granting the application subject to conditions achieves the purpose and objects of the Act.
- [10] Accordingly, pursuant to s.104(1) of the Act I grant the application for a an Off-Licence for a period of 12 months subject to the following conditions:

## The Licensed Premises

#### DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR MANAGER'S CERTIFICATE

- [1] This decision relates to an application by Macaulee George Kingsnorth ('the applicant') for a Manager's Certificate pursuant to s219 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ('the Act').
- [2] A hearing of the application was held on 4 September 2019. The hearing was attended by the applicant, Mr Samuel Kumbaroff a referee in support, Constable Graeme Jolliffe and District Licensing Inspector Hamish Little.
- [3] The application was opposed by the Police and the Inspector on the grounds that the applicant had an alcohol related driving conviction within the last 2 years.

#### **Evidence and Submissions**

- [4] We asked Mr Little to confirm the Inspector's Opposition to the application on the grounds that the applicant has had a conviction within 2 years. Mr Little relied on the Osborne decision<sup>1</sup>, which generally provides for a 2 year stand down period in the event of a single alcohol related conviction.
- [5] We asked Constable Jolliffe to read out the reasons for the Police Opposition and the statement of facts relating to the offence.
- [6] Mr Kingsnorth then explained the events of the offence and expressed his sorrow for that occurrence and confirmed that he had learnt his lesson. Mr Kingsnorth, who is from the United Kingdom explained that he had been working casually for a number of licensed premises operated by the Oxford Group whilst on a holiday visa. He had returned home after the driving offence and had initially not intended to return. He, however, changed his mind and wished to return to New Zealand and to make it his home. He has applied for a visa to stay on a more permanent basis. His application for a visa has been lodged but he has been requested to provide further information regarding his employment and skills. He told us that having a Manager's Certificate would improve his chances of receiving that visa.
- [7] Mr Samuel Kumbaroff then spoke on Mr Kingsnorth's behalf and gave him a positive recommendation. Mr Kumbaroff is the Operations Manager for the Oxford Group which owns a number of licensed premises. He spoke of Mr Kingsnorth's skills in the hospitality industry and his personal character and reliability. When asked by the Committee whether there would be a job opportunity for Mr Kingsnorth even if he did not hold a Manager's certificate, we understood him to say that the offer of employment was not contingent on holding a Manager's Certificate. He also explained that even with a Manager's Certificate there was no immediate expectation that Mr Kingsnorth would be solely responsible for one of the Oxford Group premises. For example, he said that he would not expect him to be on his own in say "Fat Eddies" (a popular bar on the Oxford Terrance in Central Christchurch) on a Saturday night, but he could begin by having responsibility on a Monday or Tuesday night.
- [8] Mr Kingsnorth submitted a number of references as to his personal character. We note that for the most part these are references in support of his visa application rather than specifically in relation to his suitability to hold a Manager's Certificate. We have accepted them as corroborating the evidence of Mr Kumbaroff that Mr Kingsnorth is of good character.

[9] Both Constable Jolliffe and Mr Little relied on the Osborne case. The Osborne case is a Liquor Licensing Authority decision which has become known as the 'Osborne Guidelines', which provides that:<sup>2</sup>

"Without fettering ourselves in this or other applications, it may be helpful if we indicate that we commonly look for a five year period free of any serious conviction or any conviction relating to or involving the abuse of alcohol, or arising in the course of an applicant's duty on licensed premises...Less serious convictions are also weighed. By way of example is an isolated excess breath/blood alcohol conviction, or a single driving offence disclosing no pattern of offending... .In these and similar cases we frequently indicate that a minimum of two years from the date of conviction may result in subsequent favourable consideration — providing suitable reports from both the Police and the Licensing Inspector are received..."

[10] On the basis of the evidence we heard we now determine the application in accordance with the criteria in s222 of the Act.

#### **Decision and Reasons**

Is the applicant suitable to be a manager?

- [11] On the evidence currently before us we have not been able to conclude that the applicant is suitable at this time.
- [12] The significance of the role of a duty manager is well known. In *Deejay Enterprises Limited* NZLLA 531-532/97 the Liquor Licensing Authority held:

The 'guiding hand' or 'hands-on operator of any company' or the potential holder of a General Manager's Certificate now receive greater scrutiny from both the Police and other reporting agencies. Character and reputation are closely examined. The law and human desires of patrons frequently tug in different directions. The Police cannot be everywhere. Little but a licensee's or manager's character and suitability may stand between upholding the law and turning a blind eye. Self-imposed standards in accordance with the law must be set by licensees and holders of General Manager's Certificates who control and Manage licensed premises.

[13] We accept that Mr Kingsnorth has been a hardworking and diligent employee and he is highly regarded by many, however, he demonstrated poor judgment when he drove with excess blood alcohol. He acknowledged the risk that placed others in. We accept that he is genuinely remorseful for that event. But for the driving offence we would have no hesitation in granting this application.

#### Convictions

- [14] Mr Kingsnorth committed an alcohol related driving offence just over 12 months ago. We are obliged to consider the Osborne Guidelines when considering the effect of previous convictions. Those guidelines as applied in a number of Alcohol Regulatory Licensing Authority decisions provide that where offending is not serious, or alcohol related, a two year stand down would be appropriate. Although it is a guide, we are mindful that the Osborne Guidelines have been applied consistently since 1995, with some modification, for example it is now accepted the time should run from the date of the offence.<sup>3</sup> It is important that our decision continues to maintain a very high standard for persons holding a Manager's Certificate because of their front-line responsibility for ensuring the Object of the Act is met.<sup>4</sup>
- [15] We are required to act cautiously and should only depart from the guidelines in exceptional circumstances so as to maintain consistency and high standards.<sup>5</sup>
- [16] Although Mr Kingsnorth clearly regrets the offence and is otherwise of good character, we do not find those circumstances to be exceptional. The fact that holding a Manager's Certificate may assist with his visa application is not a matter relevant to our considerations under s222 of the Act.

#### Recent industry experience

[17] The applicant has worked at licensed premises and there is no dispute as to his knowledge of the legislative requirements. Mr Kingsnorth has provided references that satisfies us that he has appropriate industry experience.

#### Training and qualifications

[18] Mr Kingsnorth has completed his LCQ certificate.

Any other matters dealt with in a report made under s220.

[19] There are no additional matters.

#### Conclusion

[20] We find on the evidence before us and having taken into consideration the criteria set out in s222 of the Act that we are not currently satisfied of Mr Kingsnorth's

suitability to hold a Manager's Certificate. That is because the conviction is alcohol related and a Manager has an important role in ensuring the safe and responsible sale of alcohol. It is only just over 1 year since the offence and his conviction. We think that further time is required for Mr Kingsnorth to prove that he is suitable to hold a Manager's Certificate. Although the Osborne Guidelines are 'guidelines' they provide a reasonable test to ensure that the standard for persons holding a Manager's Certificate remains high and our decisions are consistent.

- [21] We have reflected on the applicant's otherwise good character and feel confident that if Mr Kingsnorth was to reapply on the second anniversary of his offence, and there were no new issues of concern, then the Committee would likely view the application favourably.
- [22] Accordingly, for those reasons the application for a Manager's Certificate is declined.

(a) The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area.

#### Remote sales - section 59

Conditions applying to all remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol:

- (a) The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the licence holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site.
- (b) The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires.

- (c) A copy of the licence or a clearly identified link to such image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age:
  - (i) In the case of an order made using an internet site, telephone order, or physical order –The prospective buyer must declare that he is she is 18 years of ag or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)-
    - Once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
    - Again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

- [7] The Single Alcohol area approved by the Committee shall be the shaded area marked "A" on the plan labelled "Wigram New World - proposed layout ground floor", submitted with the complete file.
- [8] We are satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before us we are satisfied that the application fulfils the criteria as set out in s.105 of the Act and does not offend against either the purpose or object of the Act. Pursuant to s.211(1)(c) the Committees attitude to this application is therefore that it should be granted, We

hereby grant the application for variation of an Off-licence pursuant to s.104(1) for a period to the expiration of the current licence.

- [9] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically, s.46 to 63 and 231(1).
- [10] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.
- [11] The licence will continue to be subject to the following conditions:-

- (c) A copy of the licence or a clearly identified link to such image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age:
  - (i) In the case of an order made using an internet site, telephone order, or physical order –The prospective buyer must declare that he is she is 18 years of ag or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)-
    - Once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
    - Again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

Section 57 – Display of licenses

Section 58 – Restrictions on kinds of alcohol sold in supermarkets and grocery shops, and premises directly accessible from supermarkets or grocery shops.

Section 214 - Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

- [4] No other matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by s.103 accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.
- [5] No other issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to s 105 of the Act.
- [6] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.
- [7] The Single Alcohol area approved by the Committee shall be the shaded area marked "A" on the plan labelled "Redcliffs – date 21/10/15", submitted with the complete file.
- [8] We are satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before us that the application fulfils the criteria as set out in s.105 of the Act and that it does not offend against either the purpose or the object of the Act. Pursuant to s.211(1)(c) the Committees attitude to this application is therefore that it should be granted. We

hereby grant the application for variation of an Off-licence pursuant to s.104(1) for a period to the expiration of the current licence.

- [9] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, Specifically s.46 to 63 and 231(1).
- [10] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.
- [11] The licence will continue to be subject to the following conditions:-

#### Discretionary conditions – section 116 (1)

(a) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:

# Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale, detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

#### Compulsory conditions - section 116 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours while the premises are operating as a supermarket:

#### Monday to Sunday, between the hours of 7.00 am and 10.00 pm

(c) Drinking water will be freely available from the premises to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

#### Single Area Condition – section 112

(a) Only the area described and delineated on the plan approved by the District Licensing Committee is the permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol with the premises as required under s.112.

#### Other discretionary condition – section 117

(a) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:

# Alcohol must only be sold and supplied on the premises within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

#### Remote sales - section 59

Conditions applying to all remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol:

- (a) The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the licence holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site.
- (b) The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires.
- (c) A copy of the licence or a clearly identified link to such image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age:
- (e) In the case of an order made using an internet site, telephone order, or physical order –The prospective buyer must declare that he is she is 18 years of ag or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)-
  - (i) Once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
  - (ii) Again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

#### Other restrictions and requirements

Section 56 – Display of signs

Section 57 – Display of licenses

Section 58 – Restrictions on kinds of alcohol sold in supermarkets and grocery shops, and premises directly accessible from supermarkets or grocery shops.

Section 214 - Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

A copy of the licence setting out the conditions to which it is subject is attached to this decision. This licence has been granted for 3 years.

Pursuant to s211 (1) (c) the Committees attitude to this application is therefore that it should be granted. We hereby grant the application for an Off-licence pursuant to s104 (1) for a period of 3 years.

- [9] The applicant's attention is drawn to s259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically s46 to s63 and s231 (1).
- [10] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.
- [11] The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

#### Discretionary conditions - section 116 (1)

(a) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:

# Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale, detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

#### Compulsory conditions - section 116 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours while the premises are operating as a bottle store:

#### Monday to Sunday, between the hours of 9.00am to 11.00pm

(c) Drinking water will be freely available from the premises to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

#### Other discretionary condition - section 117

(a) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:

# Alcohol must only be sold and supplied on the premises within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

#### Restricted and supervised areas section 119(2)

(a) The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area.

#### Remote sales - section 59

Conditions applying to all remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol:

- (a) The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the licence holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site.
- (b) The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires.
- (c) A copy of the licence or a clearly identified link to such image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age:

- In the case of an order made using an internet site, telephone order, or physical order –The prospective buyer must declare that he is she is 18 years of ag or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)-
  - Once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
  - Again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

#### Other restrictions and requirements

Section 56 – Display of signs

Section 57 – Display of licenses

Section 58 – Restrictions on kinds of alcohol sold in supermarkets and grocery shops, and premises directly accessible from supermarkets or grocery shops.

Section 59 – Requirements relating to remote sales by holders of off-licences.

Section 214 – Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

A copy of the licence setting out the conditions to which it is subject is attached to this decision. The licence shall be issued for 3 years.

# From any Mini Bar to any person currently living on the premises at any time on any day
