Applicant's Undertakings

- (g) The Applicant has given the following undertakings:
 - (i) Not to sell Nitro or Smirnoff Ice or any other alcohol products containing guarana;
 - (ii) Not to well single serve RTDs;
 - (iii) To not discount or special RTD products;

Section 117 - Other Discretionary conditions

- (h) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - (i) The licensee must operate the premises in general accordance with the business Plan dated March 2019 and the evidence of Mr Jugraj Singh given at the hearing before the District Licensing Committee on 23 and 24 May 2019;
