What we are doing

We will be resealing a section of Stapletons Road on **Thursday 15 March.** (see map 1 over the page) This is to repair road damaged by our work near the creek and kerb. It is expected this work will take one day to complete.

Impacts

Residents and visitors may have a short wait to access driveways. If you need to get out, a friendly wave to a crew member will alert them. Follow their instructions, especially if reversing.

There may be limited or no on street parking in some sections during the work.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

General information

Our **standard work hours** are Monday to Friday between the hours of 7.00am and 6.00pm and Saturday between 7.30am and 12.30pm.

Important Information about chip sealing.

- Until the road is swept it's a good idea to take off your shoes before going in your house. Chips caught in your shoes can damage some types of floor covering.
- When the chip seal is new it's best to drive steady and slow over it. This protects your car from stone chips and gives a better finish.
- The road will be swept at a suitable time to give the best finish. This could be some days later. There may be loose chips on the road so drive to the conditions.



When will Stapletons Road be re-opened to traffic?

Stapletons Road will be open for <u>one way traffic</u> once the chip seal has been swept. One way traffic will travel southbound.

Opening to two way traffic is expected to be in May 2018.

Christchurch City Council will be in touch about the permanent reinstatement of Stapletons Road later this year.
