Stormwater drain earthquake repair

Contractors Brian Perry Civil, working for the Council, will start work in mid-October off Golf Links Road, to repair the stormwater drain running through Christchurch Golf Course.

The stormwater drain, called 'No.1 Drain' is a 480-metre long drain and suffered extensive earthquake damage. The drain needs to be repaired to ensure it keeps functioning, or further failure could result in an increased risk of flooding. Works involve repairing the earthquake damage to the drain, partial removal of the concrete and timber lined drain, and improving the drain's natural habitat. The water will also be treated prior to entering Horseshoe Lake.

The work will require some minor changes to the road layout as shown in the map below.

TRAFFIC PLAN GOLF LINKS ROAD:

-  No parking around key site access points to enable room for truck movements
-  Footpath closed during felling of trees, pedestrians diverted to other side
-  Site access points



These changes are expected to be in place until February 2018. The work on the stormwater drain will continue next year, and we will update you on this closer to the time.
