

Voting record on speed humps/ platforms/ LTP/ AP budgets

Request

Is it possible to please get a copy of the minutes and voting record of all speed hump/ platform projects and for the annual plans/ ltps during this term of Council?

Council Response

Christchurch City Council does not hold a list of all projects which specifically include the addition of speed humps/platforms. As you will be aware, these are usually included within larger projects or intersection improvements.

As you will also be aware, delegation for changes to the road network falls under section 334 of the Local Government Act 1974 which requires delegate decision from the appropriate community board or Council. This means that the information will be available within the associated report to the community board or council requesting a decision to proceed. These are publicly available here: [Agendas and Minutes : Christchurch City Council](#), however we do not have a way to filter these based off of one aspect of the project.

There is no legislative requirement for us to record how each elected member votes, and this will often only be included if an elected member requests that the vote is recorded during the meeting. In some cases, you may find this information recorded within the minutes when this request has not occurred, however this is due to staff preference and will not be consistent across all votes/meetings. As you will be aware Meetings are often recorded, and you can view how each elected member has voted in the associated recording which can be found here: [Videos Archive - Christchurch City Council Meetings](#).

We recognise the increasing interest in how elected members vote, and due to this, we are looking at tracking this as part of our general processes moving forward, starting from the next council triennium. There is no plan to backdate this, as we have no way of ensuring accuracy.

We do not have the resources to create this information in the way which you have requested it, to do so would require staff to manually go through all council agendas and minutes and search for transport projects where these specific changes have been both suggested, and decided on. We would consider this substantial collation and eligible to be declined under section 17(f) of the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (LGOIMA). As the information is already publicly available, we will be declining this request under section 17(d) of the LGOIMA, *the information requested is publicly available*.
