The Art Gallery Car Park Cnr Montreal and Gloucester St's

Consented for carparking as per the following approval. RMA/2000/1195 - Resource consent to build a new Art Gallery with 190 bays associated staff and public parking.

New Regent St Car Park Cnr Manchester and Gloucester St's - 198 - 204 Manchester Street

Consented for carparking as per the following approval RMA/2015/715 - Permitted Temporary accommodation application for 130 carparking bays which is valid until June 2021.

If you wish to have copies of these consents and permits the Council can provide these on a CD. Please provide a suitable postal address.

In responding to this request, staff have been unable to locate the consents for the Worcester Street and Rolleston Ave car parks within the timeframes of this request despite staff's best efforts to locate them.
