Project Update

The sewer and water services renewal work has progressed exceedingly well over the last five weeks, which has presented an opportunity to complete the upgrade of the power cables ahead of schedule. Previously programmed for early next year, we are now going to complete this work by the end of July. Please turn over the page for more information on the traffic management impacts of this work.

We have installed approximately 180 metres of sheet piling in Stage One which has allowed the first section of the rock revetment wall to be constructed. Once this section is complete, the sheet piles will be removed and reinstalled between the eastern side of the Rifle Range drain and the Christ-church Yacht Club.

The new timber bridge that will span across the Rife Range drain is currently under construction off site and will be transported for installation once the rock revetment in this section is complete.

What are we doing?

From Monday 11 July, for approximately 3 weeks, we will commence the upgrade of the power cables. Traffic will continue to be reduced to one lane and controlled by traffic lights, between the hours of 9am and 7pm, Monday to Friday. Two way traffic will be reinstated outside of these working hours.

Note: Once the upgrade of the power cables is complete, traffic will return to two way. When the construction of the cantilevered path and anchor block wall is ready to commence, the site will need to return to a one lane setup with traffic lights. This will be communicated closer to the time.

Traffic Impacts

Traffic will be reduced to one lane, and controlled by traffic lights between the hours of 9am and 7pm, Monday to Friday. Two way traffic will be reinstated outside of these working hours.

Outside of our working hours, we will be using steel plates and temporary asphalt to allow two way traffic to travel through the site. These have had a high friction surface added. Please be on the lookout for changes to the traffic management and follow the signs. In some locations, cyclists will merge with traffic so please be patient and do not overtake the cyclists.

The speed limit in and around our site is 30km/h, please adhere to this to ensure we keep not only our workers safe but the public also. Driveway and pedestrian access will be maintained around our work site. Our friendly on-site staff can also assist with any queries.



We are doing our best to give you accurate timeframes but unforeseen issues like weather, buried obstructions and unknown services can make work take longer.

Alternately, sometimes we find ways to speed up, which means we may carry out some works sooner than expected - and be gone sooner!
