

TMP items:

Reference to Generic TMPs:

Generic TMPs were talked about and there's been a question asked about where to find these on our website. We don't have generic TMPs on our website. You as the contractor need to engage a TMP provider to get these and in some situations you'll be able to use a Generic TMP for Vehicle Crossing works. You will still require a site specific CAR for the works.

Traffic Management Plans at a reasonable cost:

Who can supply what you need at a reasonable cost? We cannot advise who you should or shouldn't use or what they will cost. You'll have to ask around and decide what is reasonable to you.

Timeframes:

CAR Application Approval: 5 Working days.

Works Completion Notice (WCN): 15 Working days.

Please note that you must supply compliance evidence with this and if everything is ok **this releases the Confirmation of Compliance which will still be issued as before***

*But what if council inspects instead of us as the contractor self-**certifying**? Whoever it is from Council who inspects your crossing should let you know same day if it is ok to seal or not.

Warranty: Finishes 2 years after WCN Acceptance. WCN restarts if the crossing fails within that timeframe.

Other items:

Who pays the extra costs? Ultimately the customer pays. It is not fair and reasonable for the contractor to be expected to absorb the costs and potentially lose money.

Is a pre-**approval still required**? If you are installing a new crossing, or modifying an existing, then yes, you still need to submit a pre-approval application.
